2005 – Florida Legislature passed, and the Governor signed, SB 444, dedicated revenue source for water protection and sustainability.


2009 / **2010** – Legislature chose to disproportionately reduce water funding in the state budget compared to other public funding areas, totally eliminating this support.


Current – Funding has not been restored and water resource challenges which need to be addressed have multiplied exponentially.

The Time is Now!

Conservative estimates from government and industry sources reveal a need of \$42.15 Billion over the next 15 years for drinking water, wastewater, stormwater and water quality protection.
